CORRESPONDENCE: The President, read a letter from Mrs Carlson of Wrightwood; who informed us that the name of Desert Springs, Phelan and Wrightwood-had been left off of a large Display Map-an Exhibit at the Orange show-by the Harris Company, in San Bernardino-showing all the Towns and Cities in San Bernardino County. Discussion followed. Trudy Wurzburger moved we write a letter to the Harris Company in San Bernardino-telling them how we felt about the oversight. Second by Bill Aldrich-Motion carried.

OLD BUSINESS: The President reported his findings regarding the Installation of the Street Light-to be installed at the Intersection of Mountain Road and Hiway 138---explaining he had contacted the County and the Calif. Electric Company and his findings on the County were that we had to set up a District and have 10% of the Voters NO PROTEST or 1% PROTEST-that we deposit one half of the Electric Bill for the year in the amount of \$54.00. For a 20,000 Lunar Mercury Vapor Street Light, but it would not be installed before July 1, 1963. and \$20.00 a year for an Audit of the books.

The Calif. Electric Power Company, would install the same kind of Light on their pole-for the same price by the month,\$9.04. That we sign a three year contract to guarantee the continuance and cost of operation and they would install it right away or as soon as possible. Bill Aldrich moved we underwrite the bill and accept the Calif. Electric Power Company right away. Second by Kate Biersach-Motion carried.

Maxine Lyon moved that we have two dinners a year, (Dime a Dip) the first one to be at our next meeting, Saturday April 28, 1962. at 6:30 P.M. Proceeds to be used to pay the Electric Bill. Second by Bill Aldrich. Motion carried.

Mr Kipf asked about the Name Change? The President stated; he hadn't heard if they would or wouldn't change the Name.

NEW BUSINESS: The Electric Bill of \$4.64 was presented for payment. Mr Kipf moved we pay the bill. Second by Mr Jasinowski-Motion carried.





Announcement was made that the Gem Club would have a Mineral Display at the Victorville Fair, Saturday and Sunday-May 5, .962.



TREASURER REPORT: Treasurer Lois Tanner reported a deposit of \$25.00 in the general fund--gave us a balance of \$166.81 And \$116.48 in the New Account for the Street Light.

GUESTS: Preceeding the meeting-President Leroy Wurzburger introduced Congressman Harry Shepherd and thanked him for helping him get a prompt interview with one of the Postal Officials, while he was in Washington D.C.

Mr Shepherd thanked the President for inviting him to visit us in Desert Springs and to meet the people of this small Community-even if it was the first time in (26) years. 

He told us that if some of the people would not waste the water- we would have enough to supply our needs--but maybe not as much as we would like to have. He explained that if any one was found wasting water their meter would be turned off or the meter removed.

Questioned on what he was supposed to do? He told us in compliance of his contract with the Public Utilities Commission-- he was to put in a new pipe line--when or where ever needed. And that that (15) meters had been installed.

Mr Wurzburger, said it had neen rumored around and that he had been questioned about having stock in the Water Company-and that he wanted it to go on record, while Mr Schwartz was here-that he did not have any stock or never had in the Smithson Springs Water Company.

NEW BUSINESS: The President told us he had notice; that we should change the name of The Desert Springs Chamber of Commerce-To Pinon Hills, Chamber of Commerce, since the Town and Post Office-had been changed. Bill Becker moved we change the name of The Desert Springs Chamber of Commerce To Pinon Hills Chamber of Commerce. Second by Jack Grant Motion carried.

Motion of adjournment made by Jack Grant-second bt Tommy Dobbs. Motion carried.



Proceeds from the Supper was \$55.00




Mr Jones moved we buy 100 gallons of oil-Second by Bill Van Sickle-Motion carried.
