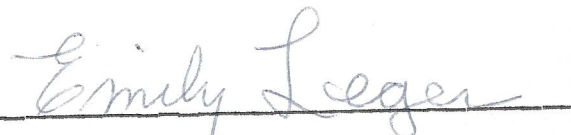
It was noted by Mr Leger that a thank you should be sent to Stan Smith for his interest and information at the meeting held for the continueing of our Post Office "as is".

OCTOBER 28, 1976

Was opened at 7:45 P.M. by President Ken Kelly. The minutes from the May 21, 1976 meeting were read and accepted. The Treasurer's report was read and a balance of \$197.22 was noted.

The problem of the street light at the corner of Mountain Road and Highway 138 seems to be at a stand still. The answer from Assemblyman Chimbole stated the same facts as we had there is not enough people using the road after dark to warrant a street light. It will be up to the membership to raise enough funds with a bake sale or fund raising event.

Mr Lee asked who is responsible for keeping the roads in the area surfaced? Specifically Smoke Tree road leading to the Boy Scout Camp. It is noted we do not have road service but in his case the solution to slowing down the traffic to the Camp might be traffic bumpers such as the shopping centers parking lots have. Mr Berry asked if we might not ask the county to at least fix the access to the Post office and store area. Mrs Hand made a motion that we write a letter to that effect it was seconded by Mr Berry and passed by the members. A committee of Mr Berry and Mr Christman was appointed for that purpose. Mr Berry asked if the street light couldn't be pursued farther, and Mr Kelly appointed him to carry on that project as a committee of one in the Chambers name.

Mr Kelly appointed a committee to submit nominations for the officers for the Chamber of Commerce for 1977. Two Directors Mr Wiesman and Mr Christman, from the membership Mrs Berry.

The meetings for November will be Friday the 10th of Nov. for the board of directors and Nov. 19th for the regular meeting. The December meetings will be Dec. 10 for the directors and Dec 17th for the regular meeting. The meeting on the 19th will be nominations and voting for new officers.

It was moved by Mr Lee and seconded by Mr Leger that the meeting be adjourned at 9:00 P.M.

A motion was made and carried to write a letter to the County in an effort to have the price of the lot decreased.

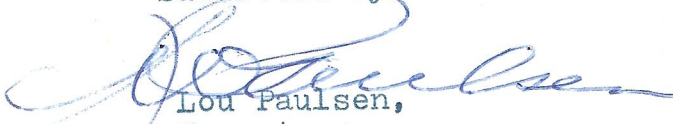
A suggestion was made and approved that a determined effort be made to achieve property tax exemption status for the Chamber.
